



Board of Directors

The Board of Directors serves as the highest leadership body of the organization to satisfy its legal and ethical fiduciary duties. The Board is responsible for:

- determining the mission and purposes of the organization
- selecting and evaluating the performance of the Executive Director
- strategic and organizational planning
- ensuring strong fiduciary oversight and financial management, including approval of annual budget
- developing, approving and following the organization's bylaws, policies, and board resolutions
- participating in fundraising and resource development
- approving and monitoring NCRCT's programs and services
- enhancing NCRCT's public image
- assessing its own performance as the governing body of NCRCT

Expectations:

- support the organization's mission, values and programs
- serve as active ambassadors for the organization by engaging in identifying and securing the financial resources and partnerships necessary for NCRCT to advance its mission and values.
- maintain confidentiality about all internal matters of NCRCT
- prepare for, attend, and conscientiously participate in board meetings and at least one subcommittee
- give a meaningful personal financial donation annually
- sign an annual conflict-of-interest disclosure, update it if necessary, and disclose potential and actual conflicts during meetings

Term of service: 3 years, with the possibility of being re-elected
