A LETTER FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

GOVERNER NEWSOM'S BUDGET RESTORES VICTIM OF CRIME FUNDING (VOCA) FOR 24-25

In our previous newsletter, I shared the potentially devastating news of a 44.7% cut to the funding of the North Coast Rape Crisis Team. I have wonderful news to share; California will **not** allow survivors to bear the burden of the federal cut, and Governor Newsom has approved \$103 million dollars to backfill the gap for the upcoming year! Our statewide advocacy efforts were hugely successful; THANK YOU to those of you who reached out to stress the importance of survivors having access to acute and healing services.

My team and I danced, laughed, cried, and, finally, took a deep breath when the news broke; we are grateful that our services, along with 600 other victim service providers, are funded for one additional year, but we also understand this is just the beginning. With celebrations winding down, a clear mission has arisen: securing permanent funding for Rape Crisis Centers is a critical necessity!

When I speak with community members, they often believe that our team is an extension of Humboldt and Del Norte County governments; the simple truth is this: **we are not**. Some believe that funding for our first responders, like sexual assault counselors, must be steady and untouchable, but this year proved above all else; **it is not**.

Rape Crisis Center funding is predicated primarily on funds deposited into the Victim of Crime Act (VOCA) coffer at the federal level. These are not taxpayer dollars; they are funds from corporate malfeasance, mostly fines. These funds are then distributed to each state, which then support crucial social services. The sad truth is this: Federal VOCA funds will not be refilled to pre-2023 levels until at least October of 2026, so the crisis of funding the North Coast Rape Crisis Center continues, and we must look to our communities for support.



Bill AB 2432 is currently in the Senate Appropriations Committee and will be heard in August.

If it makes it out of Appropriations, we will need YOUR support to help establish a new permanent funding source for crime victim services before the Senate's final vote!




